## Pastoral Pondering

God is fair. God doesn't demand that we give him that which is not his. But God does insist that we give him all that is his due. Jesus says in this weekend's Gospel, "Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and give to God the things that are God's. (Mt 22:21)" Every now and then, it's good for us to reflect on this short but profound teaching of Jesus. What indeed is God's and are we being honest in giving to God that which belongs to him? Jesus doesn't want temporal things, namely, those things which will last only for a short time. Taxes belong to the government! What Jesus wants is much more intangible and lasting than mere coins. What Jesus believes belongs to God is our hearts, our minds, our strength, our souls! All that we are created to be belongs to our Creator God! Put in another way, Jesus wants our lives, which were gifted to us by God, to be continually placed at the service of the Kingdom of God, making God's vision for our world greater with each passing day. He wants us to use our talents and treasures in such a way as they will aid us in making God's kingdom come to its fullest realization. In this respect, the temporal things we have on this earth are to be used insofar as they assist us in bringing people closer to God and making God's presence more felt by those far off and alienated. Sometimes this may mean working with government initiatives to protect the rights and dignity of others. At other times, it may mean standing in opposition to those elements in society which proclaim death, destruction and alienation from God. Sometimes, we must stand alone and be the light in the darkness of our Christian faith, and at other times, we can be one of many candles shining a bright light on an injustice that needs to be corrected. Perhaps this week, we can each take some time to reflect on how generous we have been in giving to God the things that are God's.
