Pastoral Pondering

I don't think that I need to convince you that we live in a highly critical, judgmental world. We're surrounded by news 24/7 and we're constantly hearing about the downfalls and shortcomings of our political and religious leaders and others when they become apparent or even suspected. If such judgments are done in a respectful manner and with an aim to correcting further injustices, then perhaps they may be justified, at times. Often, though, such criticisms are for self-aggrandizement of a particular group or with an aim of painting all such persons in a chosen field with the same brush stroke. We can be thus tempted to take on that same mindset and to be highly critical of those around us, including ourselves. Our passage from Paul's letter to the Philippians today, however gives us a remedy to such temptations. We hear Paul advise the Philippian community and us today, "Whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." Instead of trying to find the fault in another, Paul urges us to find what is commendable. Instead of finding the lies a person tells, let us focus on whatever truth there may be. Instead of focussing on the failings of a person or group, we should instead turn our gaze toward something that is worthy of praise. St. Paul asserts that if we change our focus, we will have the peace of Christ descend upon us. Perhaps then we won't be angry and frustrated at others so much. We won't think the worst of someone whom we just met. We won't be looking for the fault in individuals or in groups, but rather, point out that which is godly in their behavior. A pastoral pondering as we continue our journey in this twenty seventh week in Ordinary Time.
