Book of Blessing for your Special Intentions

We are going to try something new for a month, to see how it works. In an effort to let parishioners know of relatives and friends who are in need of prayers, we will be introducing a book of blessing in the back of the church, where you can write the name, your relationship to the person, and the reasons for the prayers needed for that person (for example, Joe Smith, cousin of Jane Doe who is recovering from heart surgery) The intention can also be for a deceased relative. These intentions will be read before the opening hymn by the leader of song and those present will be asked to keep them in prayer during the mass. *Please note, that in order for you to write an intention in the book for someone other than yourself, you must receive the person's permission beforehand and check the box, stating that you have such permission!* If it is a chronic condition that needs prayer, please only include it in the book once per month, as chronic conditions can sometimes last for years.

The inspiration for this book of blessing is that some people get surprised when they hear of a name of a person in the Prayers of the Faithful for the first time. Sometimes too, the parishioner isn't sure if they heard the name correctly. In addition, those in attendance may know the name of the person in the Prayer of the Faithful, but not how that person is related to a parishioner. It also can get quite cumbersome, at times, to include the names and the relationships to a parishioner in a Prayer of the Faithful. This Book of Blessings is meant to alleviate all the confusion and difficulty. If it seems to be working after a month, we will institute it on a permanent basis before all weekend masses. Thank you for your consideration! The book of blessing will commence the weekend of September 16-17th.

Pastoral Pondering

Our second reading to day from Paul's letter to the Romans reminds us of one of the priorities we made as a parish community, ever since I arrived six years ago as your pastor. Recall one of my first homilies focussed on the following verse: "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for the one who loves another, has fulfilled the law." This applied not only to physical debt but to the sort of debt we get into when we don't live as Christ would wish. One of the ways we get into this kind of debt is by our lack of forgiveness. We owe it, as Christians, to forgive one another because Christ has already forgiven us! Another way we get into debt is by our self-centeredness, thinking only of our own lives and not attempting to help others who are in pressing need, when it is in our capacity to do so. Another way we get into debt is by judgements of others. We may think that they are not worthy of our time or attention. We may think that they have made serious mistakes in life and should find a way out of it themselves. Another way we get into debt is by our refusing to change according to God's purpose and design for our lives. When we resist the voice of the Spirit urging us to change directions, or when we resist undertaking some important task that God has charged us to do for Him, then we're seriously in debt, and not the good kind! The only debt, remember, that God wants us to have, is the debt to love another! Love covers a multitude of our imperfections and shortcomings. Love heals seeming impossible situations and relationships! Love overrides our self-centeredness and our need for control. The way we grow in love is by developing and maintaining a deep, personal prayer life with the Lord and allowing ourselves to be vulnerable to the Holy Spirit all the time. When we do so, we will discover that our lack of forgiveness, our self-centeredness, our judgments of others, our hard-heartedness to the Holy Spirit melts away and what we are left with, is an ability to see others as Christ sees them and to live in full concert with God's plan for our lives. What we are left with is the debt to love one another as Christ has loved us. A pastoral pondering as we enter our 23rd week in Ordinary Time.
