Pastoral Pondering

Today, the Church invites us to reflect on the meaning of the Holy Eucharist and its relevance in our day-to-day lives. Many of us see the Eucharist as a Meal, and indeed it is! Many of us see the Eucharist as a sacrifice, and it is that too! Many of us see the Eucharist as the sure and certain sign of salvation and it is that as well! One thing it is not, however. It is not just a piece of bread and just a cup of wine. Through the words of consecration, the bread and the wine become the very Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! That is why we say Amen when we receive the Eucharist, because we believe it is the living Body and Blood of Jesus. Some of us may have forgotten that profound mystery or doubted it from time to time. Some of us, perhaps those who have grown up receiving communion since childhood, may sometimes fail to appreciate the great grace which the Eucharist offers our daily lives----for it is Jesus himself who enters into our bodies, minds and souls! He does this by animating our actions, so that they may be a blessing to and for others. He does this by sending us to the right people at the right time who need our help or who can help us! The Eucharist is a very mission-oriented sacrament! It's meant to build us up so that we may build others up and increase the Church by welcoming those whom the Lord places along our life's path. So the next time you receive the Eucharist, think about Jesus entering your every thought, word and deed to enable you to be his faithful missionary disciple!
