Pastoral Pondering

We hear in the first letter of John, “Whoever does not love, does not know God, for God is love. (4:8)” Just that one sentence can give us a lifetime of pondering! The lack of love in our lives for God or for others estranges us from God! It makes us aliens to the very God whom we claim to serve! Why? John tells us because God’s very nature is Love! If we want an experience of God, we need to love! And not just those who are easy to love either! No, God often sends us the most difficult people into our lives to love, precisely because he wants us to grow in our capacity to love and our capacity to be unconditional in our giving. We begin by first reflection on how much God loves us and then proceed from there, to consider how we must return that love in so many ways. Love by its nature can’t be solitary. It has a ripple effect in our lives and causes us to experience love from others around us. Hell therefore is the absence of love! It is the absence of God whose nature is love! Hell is the state in which we reject love in all its forms! As Christians, we must make it our aim in life to spread God’s love far and wide, and in so doing, give others a foretaste of the love that awaits all of us at the end of time. Hopefully all of us know God, because God is love and hopefully, all of us have committed to practicing that love in a multitude of ways to those whom God places along our life’s path.
