Pastoral Pondering

Last week, I spoke of the boldness we need to have in approaching God for mercy. Today, we see such an example in the scriptures, with Bartimaeus the blind beggar shouting to Jesus, to have mercy on him, and what's more, he's not detracted or discouraged in any way by those who were sternly ordering him to be silent. We can learn a lot from Bartimaeus, can't we?! We can learn to always seek Jesus when we are in difficulties and to call on him boldly. We can learn not to listen to those who might try to silence us or to discourage us from asking something of the Lord which may seem like an impossible request by human standards. Detractors often don't believe in the power of God to save or in the power of Christ in their own personal lives. They are negative thinkers and pessimists. Jesus though brought the Good News! He came to seek out and save the lost! We can learn from Bartimaeus to never give up hope that Christ will hear us, despite the protestations of the crowds around us. Jesus particularly listens to the weak and the faint of heart over the boisterous and the strong. He calls Bartimaeus to him and asks him to state his request plainly. We need to do likewise.---No beating around the bush! Jesus knows our heartfelt needs and desires before we even ask them, but he wants us to name them nonetheless. He does this to give us a dose of humility, to acknowledge that what we are asking for is beyond our own abilities to accomplish. He does this too, for the benefit of those who are onlookers. Jesus' response to Bartimaeus, as it is to all of us, is always based on our faith in his power to save us. The scriptures recount Jesus saying, "Go, your faith has made you well," And immediately, Bartimaeus is restored to sight! He's asked to go in order to be a missionary disciple of the saving action of God in his life! May we have such faith in the presence of Christ and never hesitate to ask him to give us healing and fullness of life! --A pastoral pondering as we continue our journey in this 30th week of Ordinary Time
