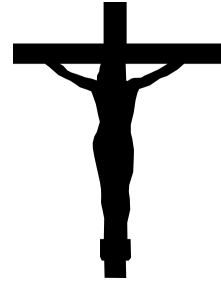

The gift of the Eucharist is for life:

On the Solemnity of the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), we celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ. The feast is an opportunity for us to deepen our sense of Jesus' presence in the Eucharist and respond in faith.

Christ is present in the Eucharist in a way that surpasses any other way we encounter Him. Christ is always present to us, especially in the Sacred Scriptures, in prayer, when we serve the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, and in the priest at Mass. In the Eucharist, though, Christ is wholly and truly present in such a way that the gifts of bread and wine are transformed.

Jesus' presence in the Eucharist leads us to ever greater life of communion with God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—a life that we can know each time we pray before the Blessed Sacrament or receive the Holy Eucharist. The gift of the Eucharist is for life. May we deepen our love of the Eucharist so that we may share in God's life more and more and make it visible in our world.
