The first weekly meeting of the Adult Faith Formation Group will be held in St. Andrew the Apostle church hall on Wednesday February 9 from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM. You are invited to join us on a journey of faith through stages of questioning, discernment of God's call, reflection on the Gospel and prayer, instruction and discussion, in a community building experience with members of the Parish. This is a time of preparation for a person who has never been baptized; for someone who has been baptized in another denomination and wishes to become a Catholic; and, for someone who has been baptized as a Catholic but who has not received any instruction in the faith. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, (RCIA), is a process prepared by the Church, through which a parish prepares and welcomes new members into the Christian community.
