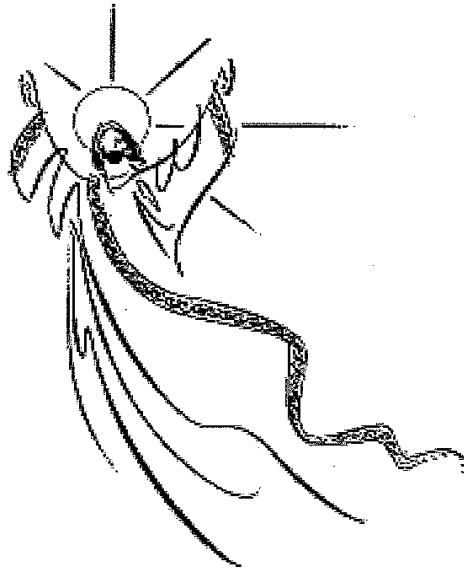


St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church
