
St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church June 12th - The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity

Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, unites us with the Father:

Jesus tells His disciples that it is the role of the Holy Spirit to reveal what is true. It is through the gift and working of the Holy Spirit, who enlightens our hearts and minds, that we come to understand that the Godhead is a trinity of persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Before His Passover, Jesus revealed the Holy Spirit as the 'Paraclete' and Helper who will be with Jesus' disciples to teach and guide them "into all the truth." The ultimate end, the purpose for which God created us, is the entry of God's creatures into the perfect unity of the blessed Trinity. In baptism we are called to share in the life of the Holy Trinity here on earth in faith and after death in eternal light.

How can we personally know the Father and His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ? Through the Holy Spirit, we proclaim our ancient faith in the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ until He comes again. The Lord gives us His Holy Spirit as our divine Teacher and Helper that we may grow in the knowledge and wisdom of God. Do we seek the wisdom that comes from above and do we eagerly listen to God's word and obey it?
