
St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church October 30th, 2022—31st Sunday of Ordinary Time

He shows the depth of his repentance by deciding to give half of his goods to the poor and to use the other half for making restitution for fraud.

Zacchaeus' testimony included more than words. His change of heart resulted in a change of life, a change that the whole community could experience as genuine. The Lord Jesus is always ready to make his home with each one of us. Do we make room for Him in our hearts and in every area of our lives?
