Jesus came to restore Paradise for us—everlasting life with God:

As Jesus was crucified on the cross alongside two criminals who were thieves, one mocked Him for his claim to divine kingship. But the other thief recognized through the eyes of faith that Jesus was truly God's Anointed King and Savior. He petitioned Jesus to treat his poor soul with mercy and pardon, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). Jesus not only granted him forgiveness, but a place with Him in His everlasting kingdom. "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Jesus died not only as King of the Jews, but as King of all nations and Lord of the universe. His victory over the power of sin, Satan, and the world was accomplished through His atoning death on the cross and His resurrection on the third day. Jesus exchanged a throne of glory for a cross of shame to restore us from slavery to sin to glory with God as His adopted sons and daughters. That is why the Father exalted His Son and raised Him in glory over the heavens and the earth. In the Book of Revelation Jesus is called *King of kings and Lord of lords* (Revelation 19:16). He now sits in glory at the right hand of the Father in heaven - and from His throne He rules as Lord over all. Do we recognize Jesus Christ as our Sovereign King and Redeemer?

Some facts about the feast of Christ the King

- 1. During the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea (325), Pope Pius XI instituted the feast in his 1925 encyclical *Quas Primas*, though its first celebration took place in 1926.
- 2. In 1969, Pope Paul VI gave the feast its current full title (the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe) and moved it to the last Sunday of the liturgical year.
 - 3. In the Protestant Church of Sweden, this Sunday is called "The Sunday of Doom."
 - 4. Some Anglicans refer to this Sunday as "Stir-up Sunday."
- 5. The "Christ the King" statue in Poland is one of the largest statues of Jesus in the World. At 33 meters tall (one meter for each year of Jesus' life).


