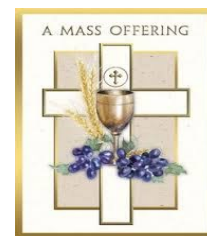

God gives us supernatural joy with hope in His promises:

Do we recognize the indwelling presence of the Lord Jesus in our lives? Blessed are we if we see and recognize the Lord with the "eyes of faith". The word "blessed" [*makarios in Greek*] literally means "happiness" or "beatitude". It describes a kind of joy which is serene and untouchable, self-contained and independent from chance and changing circumstances of life.

There is a certain paradox for those "blessed" by the Lord. Mary was given the "blessedness" of being the mother of the Son of God. That blessedness also would become a sword which pierced her heart as her Son died upon the cross. Anselm, a great teacher and Archbishop of Canterbury (1033-1109), spoke these words in a homily: "Without God's Son nothing could exist; without Mary's Son, nothing could be redeemed." To be chosen by God is an awesome privilege and responsibility. Mary received both a crown of joy and a cross of sorrow. Her joy was not diminished by her sorrow because it was fueled by her faith, hope and trust in God and His promises.

Jesus promised His disciples that "no one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22). The Lord gives us a supernatural joy which enables us to bear any sorrow or pain and which neither life nor death can take away. Do we know the joy of a life given over to God in faith and trust?

Your servants to good health again. Amen.

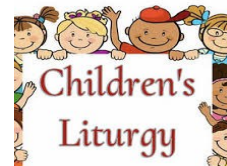
There will be **no Children's Liturgy**

therefore we will need additional volunteers to continue Children Liturgy.

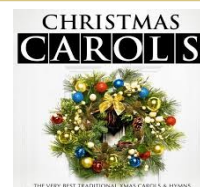

Interesting facts about Christmas

- The name 'Christmas' comes from the old English phrase **Cristes maesse**, which means 'Christ's mass'. But what about 'Xmas'? The 'X' is said to represent the **Greek letter 'Chi'** – the first letter in the Greek word for Christ, **Χριστός** (pronounced 'Christos').
- **Christmas trees** also became popular in Victorian Britain. But these were first seen in **16th Century Germany** where, at Christmas time, people decorated fir trees with **fruit and nuts** – and later sweets, paper shapes and candles. Amazingly, historians think the origins of this festive tradition may date back to the **Romans** and **Ancient Egyptians**, who used evergreen plants and garlands as **symbols of everlasting life**. Wow!
- We can't talk about Christmas without a mention to the big bearded, rosy-cheeked jolly man... **Father Christmas!** But have you wondered how he got the name **Santa Claus**? It's from **Sinterklaas**, which means **Saint Nicholas** in Dutch, the language of the **Netherlands**. St. Nicholas was a Christian bishop who lived in the 4th century – known for being kind and generous, he later became the **patron saint of children**.
- Have you ever noticed that the song **Jingle Bells** doesn't have the word Christmas in it? Or Jesus or Santa Claus? That's because it wasn't originally a Christmas song! In fact, the jolly anthem was written in 1850, entitled **One Horse Open Sleigh**, for the **American** holiday, **Thanksgiving!**

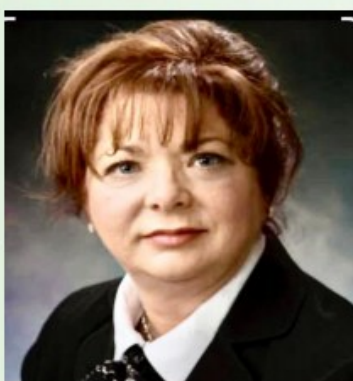
